
- **7/8 Susan, Mia,** a friend and Susan's children dove at Lanes Cove.

Bay State Council of Divers Meeting Minutes for July 12, 2006

Meeting Minutes for July 12, 2006

Meeting came to order 8PM, adjourned 8:45PM.

Artificial Reef Project: Jim Walker spoke with the Quincy Police Department about using their robot, camera and boat to photograph areas around the Pinthas. He is trying to find a time when both the equipment and Vin Malkoski are available to go do some transect work.

<u>Ted Maney - Northeastern University</u> <u>Updates</u>:

- 2 live webcasts will be aired on Saturday, July 15, at 11am and 2pm, of the exploration of the *Frank A. Palmer* and *Louise B. Crary*. Go to <u>www.nurc.uconn.edu</u> for the webcasts.
- 2. George's Island Family Fun Day: Underwater Exploration upcoming.
- 3. Annual Open House at the Northeastern facility in Nahant, September 16. Come do a beach clean-up dive.
- 4. Summer Science Academy for 9th and 10th grade students still has openings.

Dive Flag issue, City of Gloucester:

Angelo Correnti has been in contact with Dave Stillman, owner of Cape Ann Divers. The City of Gloucester has an ordinance on the books which makes the dive flag regulations more restrictive than the state laws. Dave has spoken with the Gloucester Harbor Master, Assistant Harbor Master and Gloucester City Solicitor who all believe that if the bylaw is stricter than the state law, then it is OK and they plan to begin enforcing it, with the backing of the Lobstermen's Association. Their ordinance restricts divers from coming within 25 feet of any lobster buoy. They also will require one flag per diver when diving in Gloucester.

Attorney Steve Coren (who has worked on issues of access with the Bay State Council in the past on a case in Nahant) is willing to get involved. He wants to represent the Bay State Council, i.e. the dive community, rather than commercial establishments, i.e. dive shops, dive charter boat owners, independent dive instructors. He is willing to reduce his regular fee from \$290/hour to \$190/hour, and expects the total to come to somewhere around \$3000 to \$4500.

Discussion:

- Bruce Gerhard (SSN): We need to discuss this issue with dive shop owners, charter boat operators, dive clubs and individuals for backing and monetary support. He pledged to begin by making a personal \$100 pledge.
- Margaret Malkoski: suggested shops might match donations by divers; they could put a limit if they felt it was necessary to protect themselves.
- Jim Walker: What about manufacturers? This is the beginning of trying to stop divers and diving by the lobstermen. The manufacturers should be interested.
- Need to push clubs to get members to join the Bay State Council and to raise money.
- This ordinance is already on the books in Gloucester, to make diving regulations as restrictive as possible.

A <u>Motion</u> was made by Al Bozza of the New England Aquarium Dive Club (NEADC) to retain Steve Coren to represent the Bay State Council in this matter. The motion was seconded by Bruce Gerhart of the South Shore Neptunes Dive Club (SSN). The motion was passed by those present.

Several hundred dollars were raised on the spot at the meeting to begin funding the cause.

Angelo will get the attorney to write a letter, will attach a copy of the Gloucester ordinance, and will get it out to the dive community via club representatives, etc.

Vin Malkoski - Mass DMF:

The Dive Flag Issue

Introduction by Ray Porter

Boaters, lobstermen and divers are not always a compatible mixture. Among divers there has been a great deal of discussion about what is or is not required of them while diving on Cape Ann. The confusion stems from the differences between the requirements as defined by the Commonwealth of Massachusetts and those requirements defined by the City of Gloucester. Both rules are provided below.

Whether you agree with the specific requirements contained in the Gloucester Ordinance or not, a diver should understand what the rules are when diving in Gloucester waterways. The boat traffic passing in and around Cape Ann is heightened during the summer. Extra caution by divers (i.e., carrying extra dive flags and surfacing closer to the flag) than may be defined by state law seems prudent.

GENERAL LAWS OF MASSACHUSETTS

Chapter 90B: Section 13A. Every scuba diver or group of scuba divers while swimming on or under the surface of the waters of the commonwealth shall display for each diver or group of divers as a warning device to boat operators, a diver's flag, so called, constructed of rigidly supported material at least twelve inches by fifteen inches in area of red background with a white diagonal stripe. Such diver's flag shall be displayed on a boat or surface float and shall extend a minimum distance of three feet from the surface of the water. Divers shall remain in an area within one hundred feet of such displayed diver's flag while at or near the surface of the water. A boat operator within sight of a diver's flag shall proceed with caution and within a radius of one hundred feet of such flag shall proceed at a speed not to exceed three miles per hour.

Gloucester Ordinance Sec. 10-81. Scuba and skin diving.

(a) *Driver's flag.* Scuba or skin divers within the Gloucester waterways shall display a diver's flag consisting of a white diagonal stripe on a red field not less than twelve by fifteen inches (12 X 15) in size. The flag shall be displayed upright on a float or similar device at a height sufficient to be seen by passing vessels. The diver shall trail this flag while submerged, unless the harbormaster grants permission to do otherwise, and shall surface within twenty-five (25) feet of the flag.


(b) *Distance from buoys*. The diver shall maintain a distance of at least twenty-five (25) feet and stay clear when vessels are hauling traps in the immediate area.

(c) *Prohibition.* The harbormaster may prohibit scuba or skin diving in areas within Gloucester waterways where such diving cannot, in the harbormaster's opinion, be carried out safely without undue inconvenience to vessel operations.

(d) *Beach regulations*. Scuba or skin divers must comply with beach regulations promulgated by the director of public works.

(Ord. No. 17-1993, 12-14-93)



Recipe Corner

CITRUS-CRUSTED TUNA WITH GARLIC, LIME AND GINGER

This tuna dish is really great. The jalapeño pepper and lime juice give it a real tropical flavor. Very simple fish dish to make. I like to slightly under cook the fish because it will continue to cook when it is off the heat.

Ingredients:

3 TBLS finely chopped jalapeño
2 TBLS finely chopped ginger
1 TBLS chopped garlic
3 TBLS lime zest
3 TBLS lime juice
1 TBLS coarse salt
1 TBLS black peppercorns
2 TBLS sugar
1 cup dry white wine
4 6-ounce tuna steaks (1½ inch thick)
2 TBLS olive oil.

To make crust, combine all ingredients except tuna in a small pan and heat over medium heat. Heat till all the liquid evaporates. Should take 5 to 7 minutes. Remove from heat and let cool.

Pack the crust mixture onto the tuna steaks. Set aside for 30 to 45 minutes at room temperature. Preheat a heavy pan over high heat until the pan is very hot. Drizzle the tuna with the oil. Sear the tuna for 1 minute on each side. Serve and enjoy.
