The Last Dive Review by Rob Falk

The Last Dive By Bernie Chowdhury © 2000, HarperCollins Publishers

It has been said that there are old divers and bold divers, but no old, bold divers. The Last Dive by Bernie Chowdhury is the story of two bold divers. Even if you have never been deeper than 60 feet, you may want to pick up a copy. Even if you haven't tried Nitrox, or trimix... Even if you have no interest in penetrating the wreck of the *New Hampshire*, let alone the *Andrea Doria*. Even if you think cavers are insane. Heck, even if you don't dive at all! Or think that all divers are insane...

A few times over the past month I have found myself in the company of non-divers who have already read this book. Some are likening it to The Perfect Storm, in that it makes a good read for the general public, regardless of their previous interest or experience in the topic. It leaves them filled with questions about SCUBA, and gives you a new way to talk about diving with your friends who have already heard "more than enough" about your "habit."

Nova, the PBS television series, recently ran a two-hour feature called Hitler's Lost Sub. It is the fascinating story of the 1992 discovery of an unidentified World War II U-Boat off the coast of New Jersey. John Chatterton repeatedly lead expeditions to the site, penetrating it progressively and searching for identifying material over a series of summers. He eventually came to identify the wreck known for several years as the "U-Who." In the course of those expeditions, three divers lost their lives on the wreck. The Last Dive is the story of two of those men, a father and son team, Chris and Chrissy Rouse. The author, Bernie Chowdhury, was their friend, a member of several Andrea Doria expeditions, and is a noted extreme diver.

Fascinating in its detail of not only the diving that these guys did, but also in the complex dynamic between a father who was only seventeen years older than his son and buddy, this book is a genuine page turner. Starting with their open water training, we follow as the Rouses get caught up first in cavern and cave exploration, then become fascinated with the excitement of even deeper and more dangerous dives. The obsession grows as they discover wreck diving and vie not just with others, but also with each other, as they take greater and greater risk in search of artifacts, recognition, and fame.

I picked up my copy of The Last Dive on December 22, and did not put it down again, except to eat or sleep. Although I'm not sure I would have liked to be on a boat with these guys, known to their friends as "The Bicker Brothers," there is no debate but that they were dedicated and capable divers. Of course, this was not enough to prevent their deaths.

Chowdhury himself almost died from a case of the bends – one, which left him hospitalized for months and required physical therapy to enable him to walk again. He offers an extremely simple reason for the severe injuries he incurred, and for the diving deaths of others. The reason for his own mishap, in his own words: "I f*cked up."

The book takes its time in exploring the psychology of divers and of risk-taking behavior. Nonetheless, it is also loaded with stunning descriptions of cave and wreck penetration, and, in The Perfect Storm fashion, speculates about the moment-to-moment activities of the Rouses during their last dive. Sometimes, in nightmarish detail: in one gripping passage, the author describes Chrissy's lingering death by severe decompression illness:

"The team needed to know the condition of Chrissy's blood and had a sample taken. The results were not good. Instead of normal blood, the syringe contained foam...While he was being slowly killed by his deep dive, the depth of that

dive was also the only thing that was keeping Chrissy alive: Because he had been under increased pressure, the oxygen ...he had breathed underwater [was still in his brain, hours later]."

The lessons learned in *The Last Dive* are not about SCUBA diving. They have more to do the dangers of over-confidence and hubris, the fickleness of fate, and the reminder that life doesn't happen as planned, regardless of how simple or well thought out those plans may be. Better to learn that lesson over the winter, curled up with a book by a fireplace in the den, than at 235 feet, with no buddy, no back gas, and no stage bottle.

New England Artificial Reef Society

The New England Artificial Reef Society (NEARS) is a newly established group with the following mission:

"Create Artificial Reefs and provide Education about these Reefs in an effort to improve Marine Habitat in coastal waters of New England and ensure the continuance of a healthy and abundant Ocean for present and future generations."

So what does this have to do with our North Shore Frogmen's Diving Club you might be asking? Well, the answer is two-fold. First, there is little doubt in most divers minds that the waters of New England are less populated with marine life now than at any time in recorded history and the trend is fast going in the wrong direction. Second, we as divers can make a difference and by providing our Club's support to NEARS is a way to do this. Not only will members have a sense they are helping make their world a better place they can have great fun and become better divers while doing it.

I was asked by one of our more prominent members "Isn't this going to be just a drop in the bucket compared to the overall problem" My answer to this is "Maybe." Are our direct actions of creating artificial reefs going to expand the overall fish population and return the entire benthos ecosystems to a healthy environment? Probably not, but our actions in creating reefs in coastal waters using a variety of materials from cobblestones to derelict old warships will provide much needed knowledge of the affects; both short and long term benefits. It cannot be overstated how important this effort is. It's sort of how one needs to eat an elephant: "One bite at a time".

I call upon all of our members to help and support NEARS, for it will be working to make our play place a better thing. NEARS will be needing divers willing to dedicate time to be trained in safety and research methods to help gather accurate data on reef sites before, during and after deployment of the reef. NEARS, a non-profit 501(c3) will be applying to other institutions for large grants of money (many hundred of thousands of dollars) needed to tow a vessel, provide a pier for working on the vessel to clean it, and pay for some professional cleaning methods needed to ensure the vessel's subsystems don't damage the environment. NEARS will need some seed moneys to become fully capable of making these large requests. Tax deductible donations from all individuals and Dive Club Organizations will be greatly appreciated.

Many divers come back from other dive places around the world relating to us about the great dive sites in those waters and all the wonders they've seen. There is no reason we can't help make New England's waters a place all divers want to come. There are few wrecks within the average diver's capability in the New England area. NEARS can help to change that if we all work together to support the Mission of NEARS.
