North Shore Frogmen to Host INVERTEBRATE TRAINING

The Northshore Frogmen's Dive Club will host a free two hour seminar at 8PM on Thursday evening, May 6th, at the Franco American Club, 77 Park Street, Beverly. Presented by the Stellwagen Bank National Marine Sanctuary (SBNMS), the Northeast Invertebrate Identification Program will teach divers and snorkelers how to identify approximately 80 species of invertebrates found in the Gulf of Maine and southern New England. This is a photography based diver education program developed by the sanctuary for Northeast Divers. All materials for the seminar will be supplied.

Seminar leader Bob Michelson of Braintree, MA, is a published underwater photographer and videographer who has been diving for 25 years. He is a PADI Dive Master, a Specialty Instructor in underwater photography and video and a NOAA Science Diver. His work has appeared in numerous magazines and on various broadcast networks.

The North Shore Frogmen's Dive Club was founded in 1958 and meets each Thursday evening at the Franco American Club in Beverly. The frogmen participate in weekend local dives, beach cleanups and marine management programs. 

MA Biodiversity Days Call for divers

Hi All,

As many of you may already know, The Commonwealth of Massachusetts will not be coordinating MA Biodiversity Days for 2004 due to a lack of funding. There is a plan underway where the MA Association of Conservation Commissions will assume this leading role beginning in 2005. Until that time, many associations involved with MA Biodiversity Days will continue with the tradition and hold their own individual bio-blitz events in 2004. We will be once again be partnering with the folks at Joppa Flats (MA Audubon Society) and The Parker River National Wildlife Refuge (USFWS) on June 6, 2004. We will conduct fish and invertebrate surveys in both the salt marshes of Joppa Flats near the mouth of the Merrimack River and in the ocean from the Parker River National Wildlife Refuge (Plum Island). For those brave souls who joined me last year, conditions should be much better (Nor' Easter with gale force winds and zero viz). I am looking for 2 teams of divers this year - one to survey Joppa Flats (great for new members with little experience - shallow snorkel/dive) and a second which I will lead off Plum Island (possible strong currents - suggested for more experienced divers). I need to limit the total number to the first 20 divers who respond due to parking and space restrictions at the facility. Divers will meet at The Audubon Society's Joppa Flats visitors center in Newburyport at 11:00am to enter the water between 12-12:30pm. The tide is favorable with low tide at 8:30am, so conditions and visibility should be optimum (barring another Nor' Easter). This is a family oriented event, so feel free to bring your families!! Please let me know if any members would be interested in joining me for this event.



Marine Fisheries Budget

- The House Ways & Means budget released this week reduces the Governor's recommended Division of Marine Fisheries' (DMF) appropriation by another 10%.
 - The Governor's recommendation of about \$3.7 million <u>without earmarks</u> (that require transfer of money to other entities) is absolutely essential for this agency to sustain current activities.
- DMF is currently operating with 57 vacancies when compared to 10 years ago. A reduction of \$380,000 in FY 2005 will force a staff reduction of 6 full-time employees and the likely elimination of important programs.
- Additionally, DMF lost its dedicated fund in the last budget cycle, but held on to a retained revenue account that was set up to receive federal reimbursement from Wallop-Breaux money. However, the ceiling on the account is about \$155,000, which means that Federal funds available to DMF as reimbursements for completed Sport Fish Restoration projects are in jeopardy of loss because the retained revenue ceiling is too low to receive them. Raising the ceiling to \$950,000 would allow DMF to recover (and use) federal reimbursement funds for projects such as artificial reefs and recreational fishing that we might otherwise lose. Raising the ceiling does not impact the general fund.
- Massachusetts' marine economy continues to be one of the most historic and valuable in the nation, generating \$2 billion annually. However, the ratio of state appropriation for its fisheries agency to value of its landed products is the smallest of all the coastal state.
- In the face of additional cuts or earmarks, DMF's ability to provide strong technical support to determine the condition of marine fisheries resources, for fisheries monitoring, resource surveys, and environmental protection will be reduced to nominal levels at best.
