# From the President's Slate

### Greetings to all my fellow divers!~

A few weeks ago, a friend of ours invited us to visit his cottage on the beach in Marshfield. Seizing any opportunity to be by the ocean, we drove the required two hours.

My friend had a cottage similar to one frequented by my grandparents in Gloucester when I was just a kid. I walked over the seawall to the ocean and a flood of emotions came flooding to the shore.

First, I remembered my Grandfather sitting in a cottage kitchen by the beach in Gloucester for breakfast. He would have one slice of toast, cover it with peanut butter, and then cut it EXACTLY into 4 pieces. When we went to Florida in the early '60's, my father would take one of those small inflatable floats and string it with clothesline rope so we wouldn't fall through the hole in the middle. One time, we rented a cottage on the Essex River and my dad and I would float down the river over the mussel flats for the longest time on rafts to the wooden bridge in Anisquam. I even remember coming to the rescue and finding my father's sand-colored frame glasses after they had gone to the bottom!

Most of all, the visit to Marshfield awakened the feeling of being by the sea. For my entire life, the sea has been, in someway, a part of my life. Whether going to the beach after school or "calling" off a dive and just enjoying the scenery, the sea always brings to mind such positive imagery.

Most recently, I had the fortune of attending a wedding in Gymea Bay, Australia. I was asked to do a "speech" for the newly married couple but, I must confess, I really had no idea what I would say for the longest time. I did one dive in Australia, but the only difference between New England and where I was in Australia was a thinner wetsuit. Visibility was poor

and surge was worse. So I sat out the second dive. In that time, while sitting by the bay at Bass and Finder's Point, the words and the images of what I wanted to say came surging through. I knew exactly what I wanted to say.

Many people, I know, have this same experience when they see some old Sea Hunt videos on movie night at the Franco. The early events of our diving lives come flooding through and we become immersed in the moment. We realize that it was destined that we should dive, become one with the sea, and help others see that diving is such a beautiful extension of life.

Why not invite someone to a club meeting and see if those very same emotions can be coaxed out of their soul? You may have helped to bring out your next dive buddy!

- Tom Huff of Northeast Scuba in Chelmsford came to the meeting to discuss the situation of two divers from this area who went to Florida and had problems with a dive. Paul Theriault and Joe Augusto were at 190ft, returning to the upline when Paul had some kind of problem with his regulator and then went unresponsive. Joe made the

decision to skip his deco stops in order to bring his friend to the surface, but he and the captain lost Paul at the surface while trying to get Joe on board the boat. At meeting time Joe was still undergoing hyperbaric treatments at the chamber in Key Largo, and staying at the Mariners' Hospital. Both divers were trained technical divers, using rebreathers with trimix. Under normal circumstances they should have done about an hour of deco stops.

### **Club Officers**

Nominations for Club Officers begin during the first meeting in November. I thought it might be useful for anyone thinking of running for office, or anyone thinking of nominating anyone for office, to be reminded about what the Club bylaws contain about this subject and to keep the bylaw requirements in mind.

The Club bylaws contain the following information:

Article 4, paragraph 2: No person shall be eligible to hold an elected office in the Club until such person has been a Regular Member in good standing for a period of one (1) year.

<u>Article 10, paragraph 6</u>: Any ballot with a writein candidate shall be considered invalid in its entirety and will not be counted.

### **Article 12 – Duties of Officers:**

- 1. The President, in conjunction with the Board of Directors, shall have the direction and control of the affairs of the North Shore Frogmen's Club, Inc. and he may direct such orders as are not in conflict with the By-laws. He shall countersign his name on all checks issued and signed by the Treasurer.
- 2. The Vice President shall assist the President when called upon to do so, and, in the absence of the President, the Vice President shall assume and exercise the same powers and duties as the President. The Vice President shall keep a permanent record of all Club property and the location of such property and have it readily available when needed for any Club function. The records of such Club property will be turned over to each succeeding Vice President.
- 3. The Secretary shall mail notices of special meetings, handle correspondence when directed, and keep accurate and permanent records of the minutes of all meetings held by the organization. All motions, rules, and regulations that are passed during the course of business during the year shall be listed and appended to the bylaws as a permanent record as required by law. The said listing shall state the motion, its date, and shall contain the notation that it was passed.

- 4. The Treasurer shall issue notices of dues payable and be responsible for the collection thereof; keep an accurate financial accounting of all business and social transactions, issue checks of the corporation when countersigned, deposit all funds in the corporate depository, and shall report in detail at the meetings, and at other such times as directed relative to the financial conditions of the organization. The Treasurer's records shall be audited upon the termination of his office by the President and Vice President.
- 5. It shall be the duty of all officers, at the end of their terms, to transfer all files, records, correspondence, etc., to the newly elected officers of the Club within a period of seven (7) days from the change of officers.

There has been some evolution of these positions over time. This means, in part, that in recent times the Vice President is expected to acquire raffle prizes and have them available at club meetings for fundraising purposes. The Secretary has been expected to provide a mystery raffle prize for meetings, and the Treasurer is expected to have available the necessary equipment for the "dollars box".
