Bernie Chowdhury – author of The Last Dive – is scheduled to speak on Monday, April 9, 2001, at a special meeting at the **Naval Reserve Base on Sea Street in Quincy**. Time (to be determined) will be in the evening, around 7:30 PM.

If one event can reveal the complexity of the diving world and the irrepressible bond between man and challenge – a bond even stronger than blood – it is

the one portrayed in Bernie Chowdhury's mesmerizing new book, THE LAST DIVE (HarperCollins; October 4, 2000; \$25.00).

On October 12, 1992, Chris and Chrissy Rouse, an experienced father and son scuba diving team, hoped to achieve widespread recognition for their outstanding and controversial diving skills by solving the secrets of a mysterious, undocumented, WW II German U-boat that lay in 230 feet of water only a half day's mission from New York harbor. Yet something went terribly wrong that day, and the Rouses paid the ultimate price for chasing their personal challenge: death from what divers dread the most – decompression sickness, "the bends."

In THE LAST DIVE, Bernie Chowdhury, a personal friend of the Rouses, recounts in riveting detail the events that led up to that fateful day. Yet THE LAST DIVE is more than a dramatic account of this fateful dive. Chowdhury's portrait of the complex dynamics between father and son is the backdrop to illuminate the psychology of the explorer's willingness to risk it all for the pure, raw adrenaline rush of the unknown, the extreme, and notoriety.

As THE LAST DIVE unfolds, Chowdhury weaves together the Rouses' personal story with the history of sport diving, including its legendary figures, most celebrated successes and notorious disasters. He explains the evolution of various diving technologies, including the relatively recent advances in using mixed gases.

In THE LAST DIVE, Chowdhury – who narrowly avoided a gruesome death during his own severe case of bends – examines the psychology and motivations of the explorer using himself and the Rouses as prime examples. THE LAST DIVE is a modern morality tale that examines our compulsion to seek fame while expanding our knowledge and

the limits of human endurance through exploration and extreme sports, along with the potential consequences. All divers will benefit from this discussion of safety, no matter if they venture to depths of 30 feet or 300 feet.

BIO:

Bernie Chowdhury is the founder and co-publisher of "immersed: the international technical diving magazine," a six-year old quarterly with subscribers in 63 countries. Bernie is widely known in the diving community, and frequently lectures at dive shops, dive clubs, and diving conferences worldwide. He has worn many hats during his 17 years in the diving industry, including recreational diving instructor, recreational diving trip leader, technical diving expedition organizer and leader, consultant for the marketing and development of new lines of diving computers, accident analyst with the National Underwater Accident Data Center, and co-producer of the Icelandic Cave Diving Expedition special, a documentary on the first survey and mapping expedition to any of Iceland's underwater caves, which he organized and led. At the invitation of the British Army, he also participated in the successful search for H.M.S. Pheasant, a missing WW I destroyer, which he and expedition members found and dived in 280 feet of cold, Scottish water. Bernie is a Fellow of the Explorers Club. His articles have appeared in numerous magazines, including Skin Diver, Underwater USA, National Geographic Adventure and, of course, immersed. Bernie has been named Beneath the Sea's 2001 Diver of the Year for education. Rights to his first book, The Last Dive, have already been sold in ten foreign languages.


