14 Great Reasons to try Kayak Diving

- 1. Because many of the best shore sites are often crowded or "fished out" With a kayak you can get to the places shore divers can't get to and boat divers don't come to.
- 2. Interesting shore dive sites may not be all that numerous or varied. With a kayak, you extend your range by hundreds of thousands of square feet
- Shore Dives in this area tend to be fairly shallow. With a kayak, you will find many opportunities for dives within the 50 70 foot range and more, within easy paddling distance from shore.
- 4. Boat dives are expensive, on the average of \$50 per two tank trip. Kayaks are relatively inexpensive to own. There is no upkeep, storage or fuel. Your initial investment is made back in one season.
- 5. Kayak Diving is fun. Kayaking in itself is a water activity that is growing in popularity. It is fun, easy to do, and good exercise too.
- 6. There are no exhausting surface swims. Not only do you arrive at the dive site more quickly, but also, at the end of the dive, when you may be more tired, you have no surface swim in.
- 7. Your surface support is always near-by. The kayak provides a place for reserve gear, food and water. For example, you may leave a camera in the hold while you go bugging, and then leave the lobster in the yak while you do a photography dive.
- 8. The kayak provides a place to rest between dives. You do not need to come back to shore for your surface interval, thus saving time and energy, and allowing you to cover much more territory between dives.
- 9. There's more social time during the dive excursion. Kayak divers are able to

maintain conversations while paddling, without sacrificing speed.

- 10. It's easy to bring back game or salvaged items. The kayak is a spacious and stable platform, has secure below deck storage areas, and provides good floatation as well.
- 11. You always have an ascent and descent line. Unlike diving with a flag, the kayak provides a stable descent line, upon which you may hang items, if necessary. Because you can haul in an anchor once you are back aboard the kayak, you can use a heavy or strong holding anchor, thereby providing you with a very stable ascent line when necessary.
- 12. The kayak allows the use of SONAR and GPS equipment. If you exercise care in loading and managing your kayak, even non-submersible instrumentation may be brought with you for use in the kayak.
- 13. Paddling provides the upper body workout that diving doesn't. Not only do you save the strength and energy in your legs for the dive instead of using them during a surface swim, but you also develop and work a very neglected set of muscles.


