Dive, Cook, Eat

Vinny's Double Dipped Fried Sea Clam Strip Recipe





Ingredients:

- Sea Clams (the bigger the better)
 - o Always available in the sandy area heading back to shore at Old Garden Beach
 - o Look for a hole in the sand and fan hard with hand to expose the clam
- Vegetable oil or lard for frying
- 1 cup corn flour
- 1 cup bread flour
- 1 cup whole milk
- Spices to taste
 - o 1 tbs cayenne pepper or paprika
 - o 1 tbs black pepper
 - o 1 tsp salt

Prepare the clams:

There are three edible parts to sea clams: foot, 2 adductor muscles, and mantle (strip around clam). Bring 1-2" of water to a boil in a large pot and put clams in a few at a time. Cook just long enough for them to open (you will hear a distinctive cracking sound). Remove from heat and cool under water. Remove internals of clam. You will need to use a sharp knife to scrape the adductor muscles and mantle strip away from the shell. Cut the foot away from the belly (discard the belly). Cut the three parts into small bite sized pieces as desired.

Cook the clams:

In two bowls prepare the dredging ingredients. In one bowl put the milk. In the second bowl combine the flours and spices. Place the clams in the milk. Using a strainer, remove excess liquid and then place small batches into the flour mixture and dredge well. Shake off excess and set aside. Heat oil in a saucepan on stove top to about 350F. Apply a second coating of dredging mixture (milk and then flour mixture) in small batches and then place clams in the oil until golden brown (about 60-90 seconds). Set aside on paper towels to drain.






After the first Megalodon left many Froggies with too many unanswered questions, it was decided we would sit on the edge of our seat for the sequel.

Two More Articles submitted by Mary.

Coastal Access:

Alex Vai of **Surfrider Massachusetts** (https://massachusetts.surfrider.org) attended the Bay State Council of Divers June 7, 2023 meeting in person to discuss the Coastal Access Bill. Surfrider Massachusetts, which is all-volunteer, is part of Surfrider Foundation, a national organization.

One of their concerns is Beach Access.

There are 1400 miles of coastline in Massachusetts, only 12% of which is accessible by the general public. State laws are archaic, where private property goes to low tide line, and has been in effect since 1647. The laws allow public access on those restricted properties for only 3 activities: fishing, fowling and navigation.

There are bills which have been proposed by MA State Senator Julian Cyr of the Cape and Islands, and Representative Dylan Fernandes of Barnstable, Dukes and Nantucket Counties. The bills: S.462 and H.795.

The proposed bill adds the word "RECREATION" to the wording of the current law, to allow such activities as surfing and SCUBA diving.

The goal of Surfrider is to get people and groups to work together for this common cause to educate the public and network, and to ask everyone to contact their Massachusetts state legislators to cosponsor these bills - S.462 and H.795 - proposed for the 2023-2024 legislative session.

UPDATE, JUNE 2023

An Act Relative to recreation on private tidelands (H.795/S.462) was refiled without changes at the start of the 2023-24 legislative session by Rep. Fernandes and Sen. Cyr. These bills are currently awaiting a hearing before the Joint Committee on Environment and Natural Resources (date TBD).

If you, as a diver, have a problem with any boaters, try to get the boat numbers, or at least the boat name, and call the Environmental Police right away. Don't wait until after discussing it with your friends at the next Club meeting.
